## Other Sheep I Have: Historical Sketches of Modern Protestant Missions

Led by Eric Washington (meeting in the auditorium)

In speaking to a group of Jews, Jesus referred to himself as the Good Shepherd who gives his life for his sheep (John 10:11). Also during this discourse Jesus stated that he had “other sheep” from another fold (John 10:16). In speaking to this Jewish audience, Jesus’ indicated that his followers would be inclusive of people from different nations, not exclusively Jews. Such a statement is one of the biblical bases of global missions along with the oft referred to Matthew 28:19-20. At the end of the 18th century, Protestants in England embarked upon what is referred to as the modern missionary movement. Men such as William Carey, Adoniram Judson, Hudson Taylor, and David Livingstone are important and well-known figures during this movement. There were others such as Americans Lott Carey and William Shepherd.

This class will consist of historical sketches of missionaries primarily during the 19th century, which is known as the “missionary century.” These sketches will give an overview of the global missions movement during this period and address questions of motivation of missionaries, reception by indigenous people, and impact of the missions.

## He Works All Things: A Study of Ruth and Daniel

“In him [Jesus Christ] we have obtained an inheritance, having been predestined according to the purpose of him who works all things according to the counsel of his will, so that we who were the first to hope in Christ might be to the praise of his glory.” (Eph. 1:11-12)

We live in a seemingly chaotic and frightful world, the troubles of which often trigger doubt about our sovereign God and lessen our resolve to live confidently for the praise of his glory. Yet Scripture tells us that God works all things according to the counsel of his will for the joyous salvation of his people in Jesus Christ and ultimately for the praise of his glory. In this class we will look at the books of Ruth and Daniel and recount God’s sovereign work in the past so as to bolster our trust in and gratitude to the LORD our God and Jesus Christ his Son.
